From the Pastor's Desk

Greetings in the Name of Jesus Christ,

The saying goes that a journey is begun by taking the first step, changing the world happens in much the same way. Through our support of mission and ministry we have the power to change the world. By the grace of God, all of us have to power to give, and the gifts we give transform the world into the way God intended it to be—a place where everyone has what they need. Together, we can achieve a fair balance in our world by giving back to God what God has so richly bestowed upon us.

When the Apostle Paul visited the early churches in Macedonia, they became incredibly excited about the ministry opportunities he laid before them. Namely, to be a part of an offering that would be received for the poor and the suffering in Jerusalem, due to a devastating famine. These early followers of Jesus couldn't help but get caught up in Paul's excitement for the ways in which God was working in their midst. In fact, they even pleaded to be a part of the "service to the saints" that Paul spoke of to them—even though they, themselves, were living in poverty. This "ministry to the saints" referred to in Paul's second letter to the Corinthians is another name for the offering that Paul and the early churches were organizing for this in Jerusalem. The text referred to it not as an offering, however, but as a "ministry" or "service". The offering was considered a ministry, a living out of one's faith.

Paul facilitated this offering in response to the immense needs of the people in Jerusalem who were hungry and in poverty. This ministry was a way for Paul to model the unity of all believers and to provide a practical means of demonstrating care and concern for one another---even when they did not personally know those whom they were helping.

This is still the ministry of the church today. The One Great Hour of Sharing offering (an envelope for which is included in this newsletter) is a ministry that reaches those near and far by offering compassion and generosity to those in distress and need. The One Great Hour of Sharing offering has been a means by which the churh has been able to glorify God by makig a difference in the world for nearly 70 years. The money given is used to fund relief and development efforts all over the

- Coordinator will develop schedule for team visits
- Volunteers will receive a packet to take to homebound members. Packets will contain copies of recent bulletins/sermons, and any church communications such as newsletter, etc.
- ◆ A follow-up form will be used to communicate completion of visit and concerns/observations/requests. Contents are confidential and will be e-mailed to pastor or left in church office.
- Elements will be in sealed packet and consecrated by Pastor.

Easy Breakfast Casserole

24 oz frozen hash browns (8cups) 16 oz ham (I use any ham on sale and just chop it up) 8 oz shredded sharp cheddar cheese 12 large eggs 1 cup milk 1 teas. Salt

1/2 teas ground black pepper Cooking spray

1.preheat oven to 350 degrees

- 2. Add frozen potatoes, ham and cheese to a large bowl. Toss to combine. Pour the mixture into a 9x13 baking dish that has been sprayed with cooking spray

Youth Group News


