FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Greetings in the Name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ,

'It's the most wonderful time of the year...", except of course when you turn on the news, or read the newspaper, or scan your Facebook or Twitter feeds, at which point it is the continued story of violence, fear, tragedy, racism, hatred, homophobia, xenophobia, and every other "-ism" and "phobia". I read the Hebrew scripture reading for the first Sunday of Advent from the prophet Jeremiah: "The days are surely coming, says God, when I will fulfill the promise I made..." (Jeremiah 33:14a) and I ask "when?" Or at my most sarcastic moments I roll my eyes and mutter 'yeah right", or in my anger and pain I cry out like the psalmist "How long, O Lord?" We live in a time of suffering, and turmoil and dis-ease. At times it is hard to see the hope out there...but it is there. It's there in the volunteers who show up day after day at Next Door Milwaukee to read to hundreds of preschoolers eager to learn. Hope is present in the protesters who are demanding justice for those harmed by police brutality. Hope is present in the people across Europe who are finding ways to open their hearts and their homes to take in Syrian refugees desperate to find safety. Hope is present in Madison where new initiatives are helping homeless veterans find permanent housing. Hope is there in those who work tirelessly at food pantries and homeless shelters, and children's homes. Hope is found as more people make their voices heard and insist that corporations begin paying their employees a living wage that will put food on the table and a roof over their heads.

Advent means "coming" it's a time of anticipation, but it is Frederik Buechner's description of Advent as "an invasion of holiness" that sparks my imagination. An "invasion of holiness" is what is needed right now. The days are coming, says the LORD, when the promises will be fulfilled, when the hungry will be fed, when the sick will be healed, when the homeless housed, the incarcerated will be freed, the broken made whole. And it is us, the people of God, the disciples of Jesus Christ, that are the ones to usher in this new day. To be the "righteous ones" of God, we must care for the least of these, Jesus said. 2,000 years ago a poor family of refugees fled from Israel into Egypt to escape a violent massacre of an entire generation. That family was Jesus, Mary and Joseph. Today we find ourselves facing similar tragedies: millions fleeing violence in their homelands, an entire generation of young people growing up

LITERACY CAMPAIGN SUCCESSES

If you have a great memory, then you might recall around this time last year when we kicked off our Literacy Campaign in conjunction with the United Church of Christ's National Literacy Initiative. Over the past year we have a number of successes to report:

- **1. BOOK CLUB:** We now have a joint book club with Our Saviour's UCC that meets on a monthly basis at Starbucks to discuss various books on faith. Although actual attendance averages only about 4-5, our small group has done a great job of promoting and sharing the books we read with others so our actual reach is much larger. We always welcome new participants--contact the church office for information on the upcoming selections.
- 2. LITTLE FREE LIBRARY: Thanks to Gary and Erik Johnson and Jeannie Lehmann we now have an attractive "little free library" mounted at the entrance to the prayer garden and registered with the national Little Free Library program. The concept is simple: groups like ours put up these little "libraries" outside in public areas and stock them with books. The public is then welcome to come, peruse the selections, and borrow books. You don't have to return the book to the same library, and you can put books in any library at any time. More information can be found at www.littlefreelibrary.org
- **3. CHURCH LIBRARY:** We have rebooted our own church library. This can be found on the glass shelves in the lobby, just outside the sanctuary. Books, videos, and cds will be rotated for lending periodically. In each book there is a pocket with an index card, we ask that if you would like to borrow a book you simply fill out the card with your name and the date and drop it into the index card box on the library shelves. When you return the book, take the card out of the box and put it back in the book & place on the shelf. We hope to add one or more new selections each month to this collection. Please check it out!
- **4. BOOK LIST:** We have begun assembling a "wish list" of books to add to our church library and to update our nursery book shelf. If you are interested in "sponsoring" one or more books, perhaps in honor of an event/individual or in memory, please contact the church office.

RECIPE CORNER

St. John U.C.C. has some wonderful cooks and bakers and during Fellowship, Potluck Dinners or Vacation Bible School we have had requests for some of the recipes. Each month in the Heart Beat Newsletter the Outreach Committee will enter a new recipe. If you have one you would like to submit, please drop it off in the church office, clearly labeled and we will put it in the Recipe Corner.

Buttermilk Pie

Recipe from Ann LaMarre

Ingredients:

1 deep dish pie shell - 9 inch (blind bake at 400 degrees for 6 - 10 minutes)

- 1 ½ cups sugar
- 3 tablespoons all- purpose flour
- 3 large eggs
- 1 cup Buttermilk
- ½ cup butter, melted
- 1 tablespoon lemon zest
- 3 tablespoons fresh lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Directions:

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Whisk together first two ingredients in a large bowl. Whisk eggs and next five ingredients into flour mixture; pour into pre baked pie crust. Cover edges of pie crust with 2-3 inches of aluminum foil to prevent excessive browning; remove foil during last 10 minutes of baking.

Bake at 400 degrees for 10 minutes; then reduce heat to 300 degrees and bake for 1 hour or until top is golden brown.
